	Sleeping bag
	Campfire blanket (if desired)
	Pillow (if desired)
<b>Clothing – Please send <i>old</i> clothes to camp</b>	
	4 Pairs of short pants
	3 Pairs of long pants
	2 Warm sweatshirts and/or windbreaker
	7 T-shirts
	7 Pairs of socks
	7 Underwear
	2 Pyjamas
	2 Swim suit
	1 Raincoat or poncho
	Waterproof footwear
	2 Sports hats or caps
	2 Pairs running shoes (1 old pair which cannot be reused) & water shoes are useful for water activities
	Good and comfortable hiking boots (important gear for all Scout programs)
<b>Toilet Articles</b>	
	2 Beach towels, washcloth
	Toothbrush in container, toothpaste, deodorant
	Environmentally friendly soap & shampoo in containers ( <b>not camp soap</b> )
	Comb or hairbrush
<b>Miscellaneous</b>	
	2 – 1 litre water bottles or canteen
	Plate, bowl, mug, knife, fork, spoon in a small mesh bag
	Flashlight (with extra batteries & bulb)
	Insect repellent – non-aerosol only
	Sun screen and sunglasses
	Dishcloth and tea towel
	Waterproof groundsheet or sleeping pad
	Large daypack – school backpack is fine
	Overnight backpack: <b>Brownsea</b> pack lined with strong plastic bags for waterproofing <b>Troop Trail, &amp; Survival</b> lined for waterproofing, adjustable waist and shoulder straps. <b>Troop Outdoor &amp; Paddling</b> waterproof pack or waterproof sacs for inside pack or lined with two strong plastic bags, adjustable waist and shoulder straps.

**Note: SHEATH KNIVES ARE NOT PERMITTED AT CAMP.** All youth in Scout programs may bring a pocket knife. The blade must be no longer than 7cm. (3 inches).
