- An Interview
- Reference Checks
- Police Records Check and Vulnerable Sector Search (PRC/VSS)
- Scouting Fundamentals training and Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders training
- Signed Code of Conduct (CoC)
- Council Approval
- Wood Badge I for the Canadian Path training

Week One

- PRC/VSS application complete.
- Scouting Fundamentals training started.

Week Two

- Interview complete
- Check status of Reference Checks – Contact the Help Centre if there are problems
- Scouting Fundamentals sessions 1 – 3 complete

Week Three

- Scouting Fundamentals check-in.
- Reference checks complete– if incomplete contact the Help Centre
- Scouting Fundamentals sessions 4 – 6 complete

Week Four

- Scouting Fundamentals training complete
- PRC/VSS complete and submitted
- Council Approval (If PRC/VSS is submitted)**
